HOW IT WORKS

The casino offers a progressive jackpot, plus fixed jackpot amounts for secondary hands. To wager on this Progressive Jackpot, guests will place \$1 on the Progressive Jackpot betting circle. Below are the games with Progressive Jackpot options.

- Crazy 4 Poker
- DJ Wild Stud
- Let It Ride Bonus Poker
- Mississippi Stud
- Texas Hold'Em Bonus Poker
- Texas Ultimate Hold'Em Poker

To win the Progressive Jackpot wager the player must have a 5 card qualifying poker hand to match the winning Progressive Jackpot. Envy Bonus eligibility is for whom made a Progressive Jackpot wager during the round of play. Folded hands do qualify for the Progressive Jackpot. The dealer will resolve the progressive and other wagers at each spot, moving counter clockwise from right to left.

Hand	Payout	Envy Bonus
Royal Flush	100% of Progressive Jackpot	\$1,000
Straight Flush	10% of Progressive Jackpot	\$300
Four-of-a-Kind	300 for 1	
Full House	50 for 1	
Flush	40 for 1	
Straight	30 for 1	
Three-of-a-Kind	9 for 1	

Qualifying 5 card hands are determined as follows:

Crazy 4 Poker

The player's original five cards.

DJ Wild Stud

The player's original five cards. If the player's hand contains the Joker, the dealer will substitute with another card.

Let It Ride Bonus Poker

The player's respective three hole cards and the two community cards.

Mississippi Stud

The player's respective two hole cards and the three community cards.

Texas Hold'Em Bonus Poker

The player's respective two hole cards and first three community cards, known also as the "flop."

Texas Ultimate Hold'Em Poker

The player's respective two hole cards and first three community cards, known also as the "flop."
